Course Title: Biology of Mammals

Course Abbreviation and Number: BIO 1560 Credit Hours: 1 credit hour. Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: This course studies mammals, the group considered to be the peak of animal evolution. Students will learn about physiology, evolutionary history, classification and identification, behavior, and ecological importance. Outdoor fieldwork included.

Eligibility: ENG 1510 without supports or Corequisite: ENG 1510 with supports.

- 4. Identify environmental influences on mammal survival, reproduction, and evolutionary pathways.
- 5. Apply a basic knowledge of the evolution of mammal behaviors.
